During the first half of 2010, Arianespace once again reaffirmed its position as the commercial launch service & solutions provider of choice for satellite manufacturers and operators around the world.

From January to August, we announced nine new contracts for the launch of geostationary satellites, as well as an agreement to orbit the first 10 Full Operational Capability (FOC) satellites in the Galileo constellation.

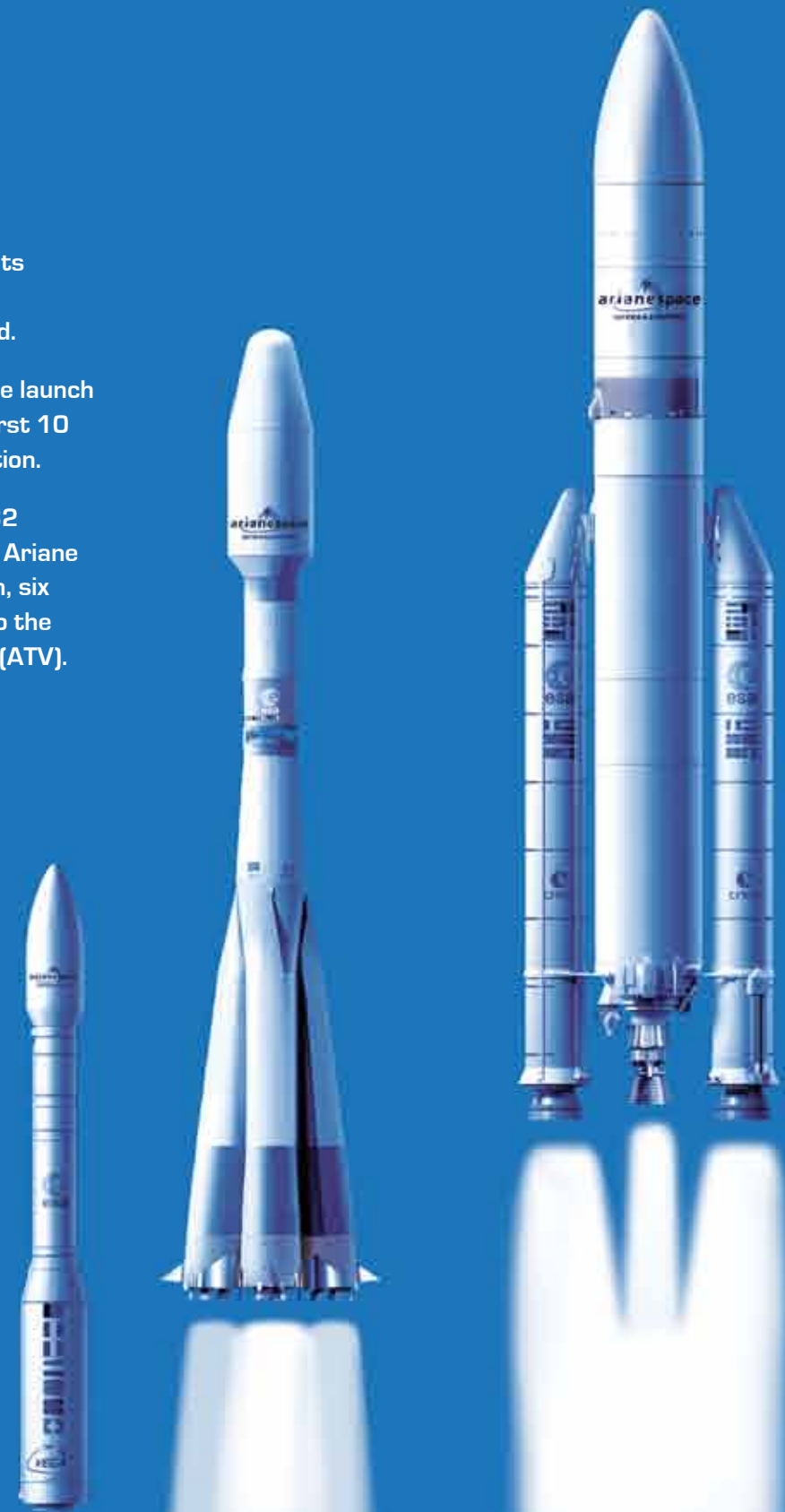
Arianespace is the global launch services industry's leader, with 32 satellites in our order book for missions to GTO with the heavy-lift Ariane 5, along with 17 payloads on dedicated Soyuz missions. In addition, six Ariane 5 launches are slated to provide cargo resupply services to the International Space Station with the Automated Transfer Vehicle (ATV).

On the operational side, Ariane 5 continued to demonstrate its role as the benchmark commercial launcher with 38 successes in a row, placing six satellites into highly accurate orbits during a trio of dual-payload missions performed from May to August.

Arianespace maintains its commitment to providing cost-effective and flexible launch services for customers around the globe. We will build on our 30 years of success, during which our company signed more than 300 launch contracts and lofted 283 satellites for 77 customers – accounting for more than half of all commercial satellites now in service.
