Arianespace flight VA239: Intelsat 37e / BSAT-4a

The launch readiness review (RAL) took place in Kourou on Friday, September 1st, 2017 and authorized count-down operations for Ariane Intelsat 37e / BSAT-4a.

For its ninth launch of the year, and the fifth Ariane 5 mission in 2017 from the Guiana Space Center in French Guiana, Arianespace will orbit Intelsat 37e for the operator Intelsat and BSAT-4a for the manufacturer SSL (Space Systems Loral) in the framework of a turnkey contract for the Japanese operator Broadcasting Satellite System Corporation (B-SAT).

With this 292th mission performed by its family of launchers, and the 239th utilizing an Ariane family launch vehicle - Arianespace is at the service of the latest innovation in space telecommunications.

The liftoff will be from the Ariane Launch Complex (ELA) in Kourou, French Guiana (South America).

Launch time



Liftoff is planned on Tuesday, September 5th, 2017 as early as possible within the following launch window:

- > Between 5:51 p.m. and 6:24 p.m., Washington, D.C. time
- > Between 6:51 p.m. and 7:24 p.m., in Kourou, French Guiana
- > Between 21:51 and 22:24, Universal Time (UTC)
- > Between 11:51 p.m. and 00:24 a.m., Paris time during the night of September 5 to 6 Between 6:51 a.m. and 7:24 a.m., Tokyo time on September 6.

1 Telephotos

- 1.1 Ariane 5 launch vehicle on the ELA 3 launch pad (at sunset), at 8:00 pm local time on September 4th, 2017 (i.e. 23:00 UT).
- 1.2 Lift off of the Ariane 5, starting from H0+1 hour 30min on September 5th, 2017 (i.e. 1:21 UT on September 06, 2017) if lift off happens at the beginning of the launch window.
